


Women in politics



88% OF EUROPEANS SAY THEY WOULD FEEL COMFORTABLE* HAVING A WOMAN IN THE HIGHEST ELECTED POSITION IN THEIR COUNTRY


This represents a 7 pp (percentage points) increase compared to 2015 (total "comfortable"): from 81% to 88%

WHILE LARGE MAJORITIES OF THE POPULATION WOULD FEEL COMFORTABLE IN ALL MEMBER STATES, SOME VARIATIONS EXIST BETWEEN COUNTRIES
